**PLEASE READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS
BEFORE BEGINNING**

- * All seams are sewn with 1/4" seam allowance.
- * Press seams toward each added piece.
- * RST = right sides together

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

Cutting based on 42" wide fabric (WOF-Width of Fabric)

From Fabric A cut:

* (6) 4-1/2" x WOF strips

* (7) 2-1/2" x WOF strips for binding

From Fabric B cut:

* (36) 3-1/2" squares

From Fabric C cut:

* (36) 3-1/2" squares

From Fabric D cut:

* (36) 3-1/2" squares

From Fabric E cut:

* (36) 3-1/2" squares

From Fabric F cut:

* (4) 6-1/2" squares

From Fabric G cut:

* (32) 3-1/2" squares

From Fabric H cut:

* (32) 6-1/2" squares

* (6) 2" x WOF strips

BLOCK CONSTRUCTION

Note: The cream squares from Fabric B, C, D, E and G can be used interchangeably in block assembly to create a low-volume patchwork look for the background.

1. Lay out four 3-1/2" cream squares into two rows of two. Sew the squares into rows and join the rows to make a four-patch unit. Make 16.

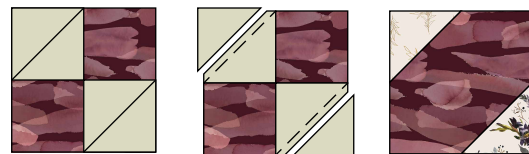
Four-patch unit

2. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of two 3-1/2" cream squares. Place the marked squares RST on opposite corners of one 6-1/2" H square. Stitch on the drawn lines, trim seam allowance to 1/4" and press open to make one H unit. Make 32.

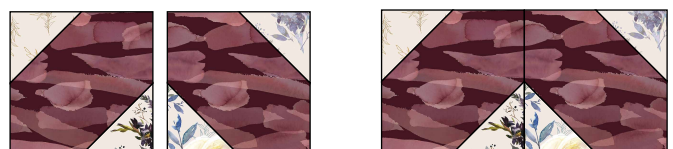
H unit

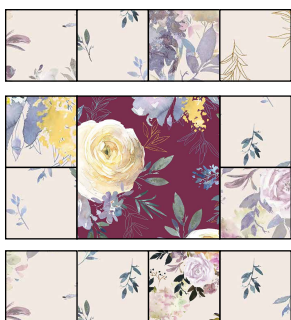
3. Sew two H units together to make a double H unit. Make 16.

Double H unit

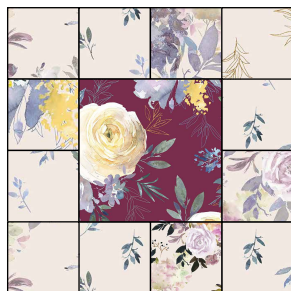

4. Join two cream squares into a pair. Make two and sew to opposite sides of one 6-1/2" F square. Sew four cream squares into a row. Make two and sew to the top and bottom. Make four block center units.

5. Sew double H units to opposite sides of one block center unit, pressing seams out. Sew four-patch units to both ends of one double H unit, pressing seams to the center. Make two. Sew the three rows together to complete the block.

6. Repeat step 5 to make a total of four blocks.

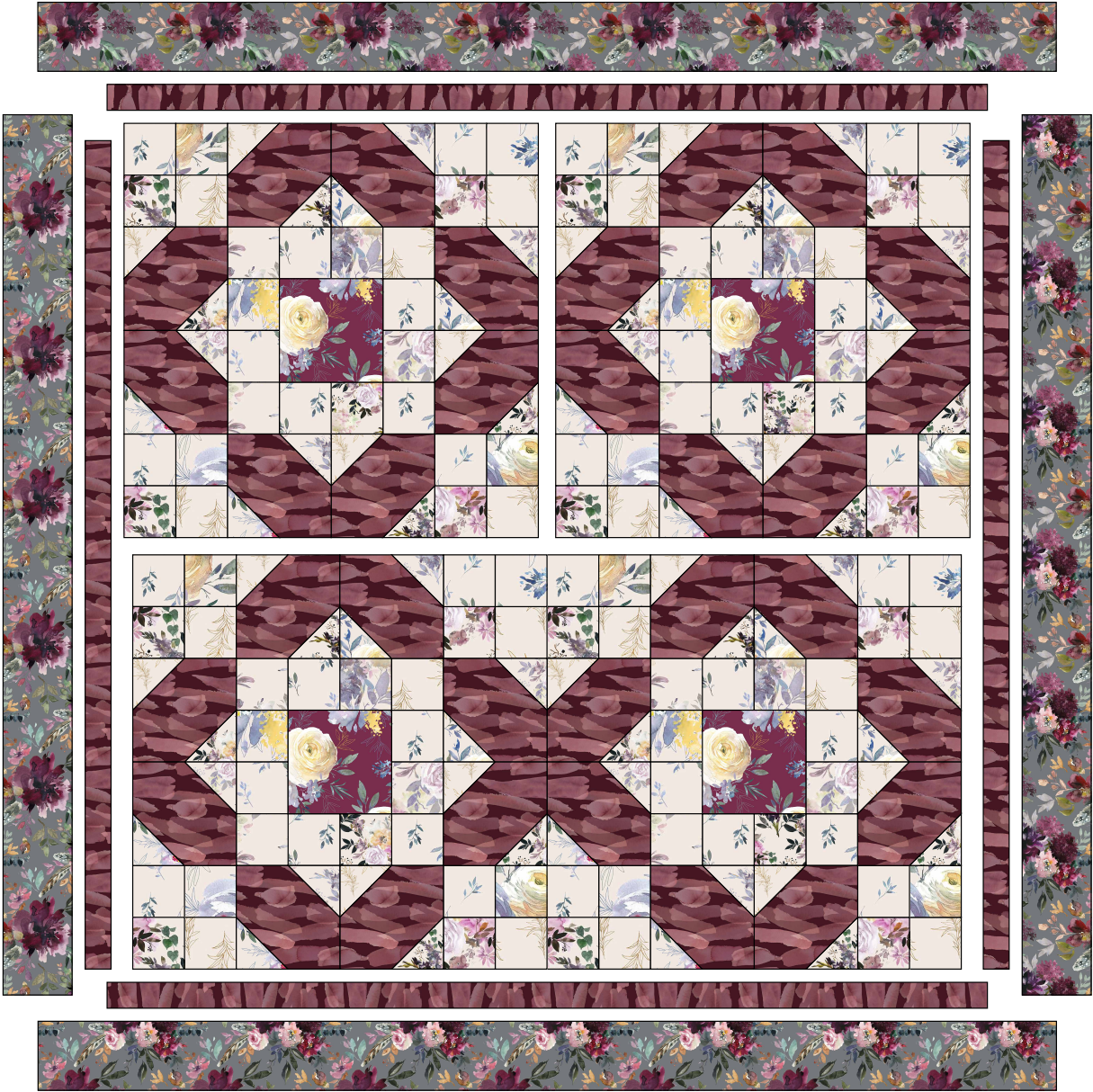
- 1.** Lay out the blocks into two rows of two. Sew into rows and join the rows to make the quilt center.
- 2.** Sew the six 2" x WOF H strips short ends together with diagonal seams. Press seams open.
- 3.** Measure the quilt through the vertical center (top to bottom) of the quilt. Cut two strips to this length. Matching centers and ends, pin and sew to sides.
- 4.** Measure the quilt through the horizontal center (side to side) of the quilt. Cut two strips to this length. Matching centers and ends, pin and sew to sides.
- 5.** Repeat steps 2-4 using the six 4-1/2" x WOF A strips.

FINISHING

- 1.** Cut backing fabric into (2) equal lengths and sew together to make the quilt back.
- 2.** Layer top, batting and pieced backing. Baste if necessary and quilt as desired.
- 3.** Sew the six 2-1/2" x WOF A binding strips short ends together with diagonal seams. Press seams open. Fold in half lengthwise wrong sides together and sew to quilt with a French binding technique. Fold binding to back and hand sew down.

Be sure to put a label on the back and ENJOY!
