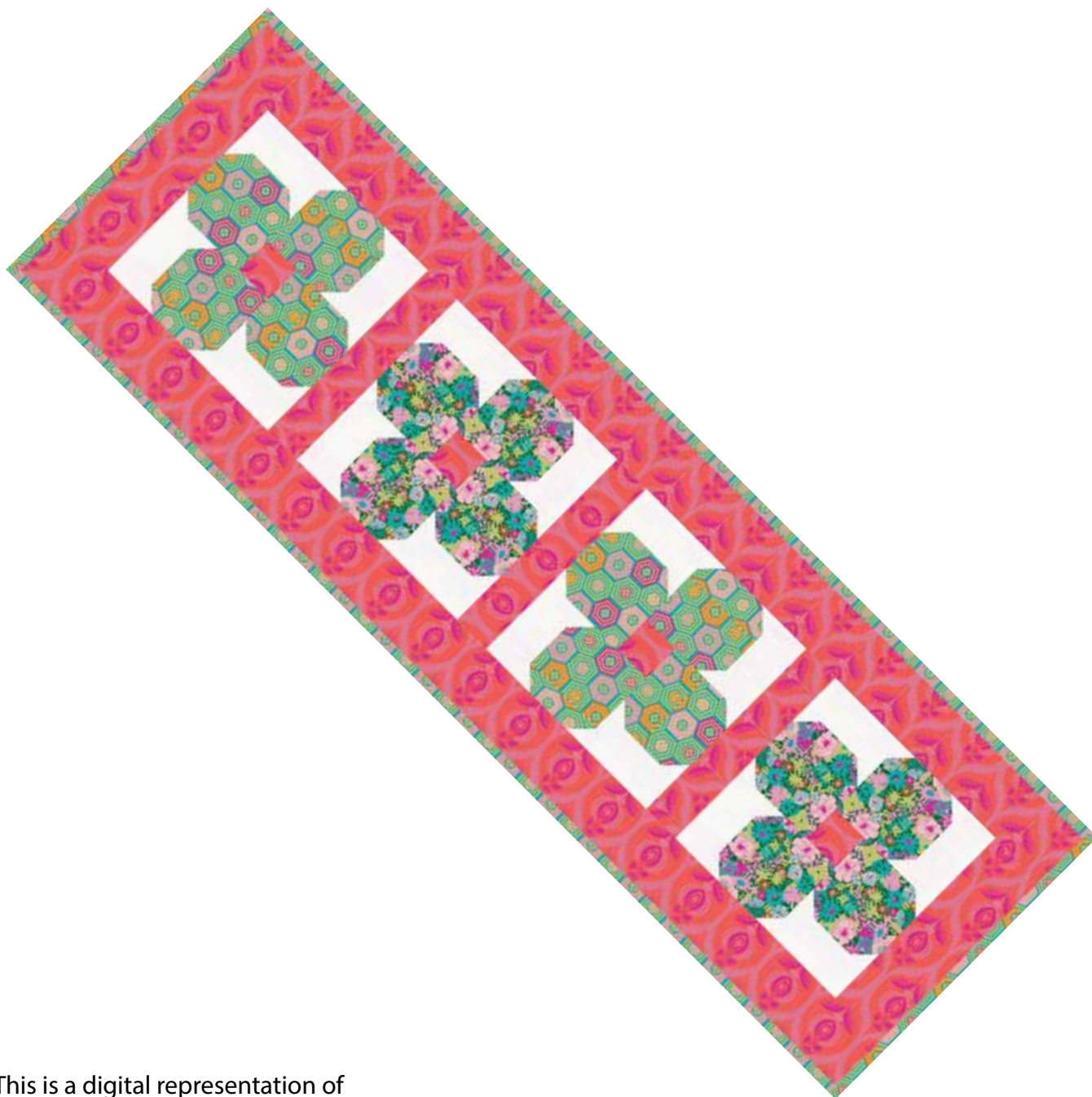

A  Amanda Green
LD3850-09
1/4 Yard

B  Kristen Green
LD3840-09
5/8 Yard

C  Kristen White
LD3840-02
1/3 Yard

D  Mel Orange
LD3820-10
2/3 Yard

PLUS

Backing: 7/8 Yard

Batting: 62" x 21"

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

**Cutting based on 42" wide fabric
(WOF-Width of Fabric)**

From Fabric A cut:

*** (8) 5" squares**

From Fabric B cut:

*** (8) 5" squares**

*** (4) 2-1/4" x WOF strips for binding**

From Fabric C cut:

*** (16) 2-1/2" x 5" rectangles**

*** (48) 1-1/2" squares**

From Fabric D cut:

*** (4) 3-1/2" x WOF strips; subcut (2) 3-1/2" x
11-1/2" strips and reserve remainder for long
border strips**

*** (3) 2-1/2" x 11-1/2" rectangles**

*** (4) 2-1/2" squares**

PLEASE READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE BEGINNING

* All seams are sewn with 1/4" seam allowance.

* Press seams toward each added piece.

* RST = right sides together

BLOCK CONSTRUCTION

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of three 2" C squares. Place a marked square right sides together on a corner of one 5" A square. Stitch together on the drawn line, trim seam allowance to 1/4", and press open. Repeat on two additional corners to make a petal unit. Make a total of four A-C petal units.

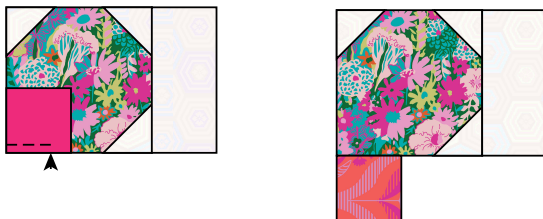
2. Sew (1) 2-1/2" x 5" C piece to each petal unit, orienting as shown to make a quarter block unit. Make four.

3. Lay (1) 2-1/2" D square right sides together with (1) quarter block unit as shown. Stitch together, stopping 1" before the end of the square for partial seam block assembly (see arrow). Press open.



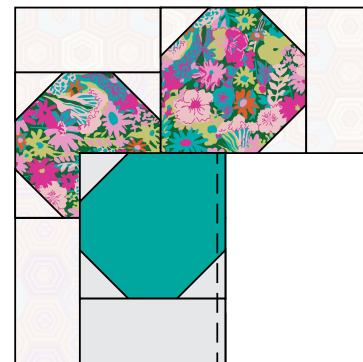
4. Sew another quarter block unit to the left side of the unit from step 3 as shown. Press open.



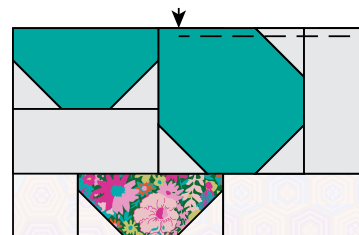
5. In the same way, add a third quarter block unit to the bottom of the unit from step 4 as shown.



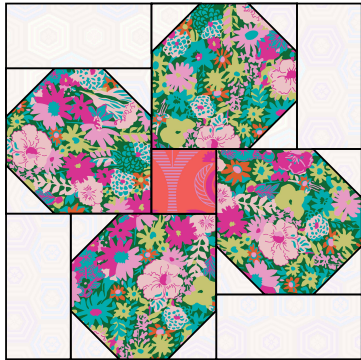
6. Align the fourth quarter block unit along the right side of the unit added in step 5 and stitch in place.



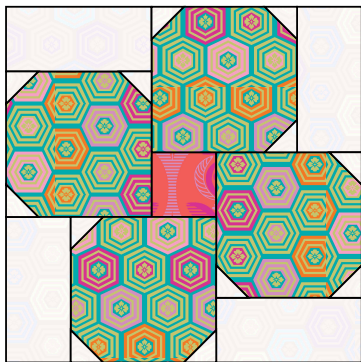
7. Fold the unit so the remaining raw edges from the seam sewn in step 3 align with the fourth quarter block unit and finish sewing the seam from the arrow to the block edge.



8. Repeat steps 1-7 to make a total of two A flower blocks and two B flower blocks, each measuring 11-1/2" square unfinished.

FINISHING

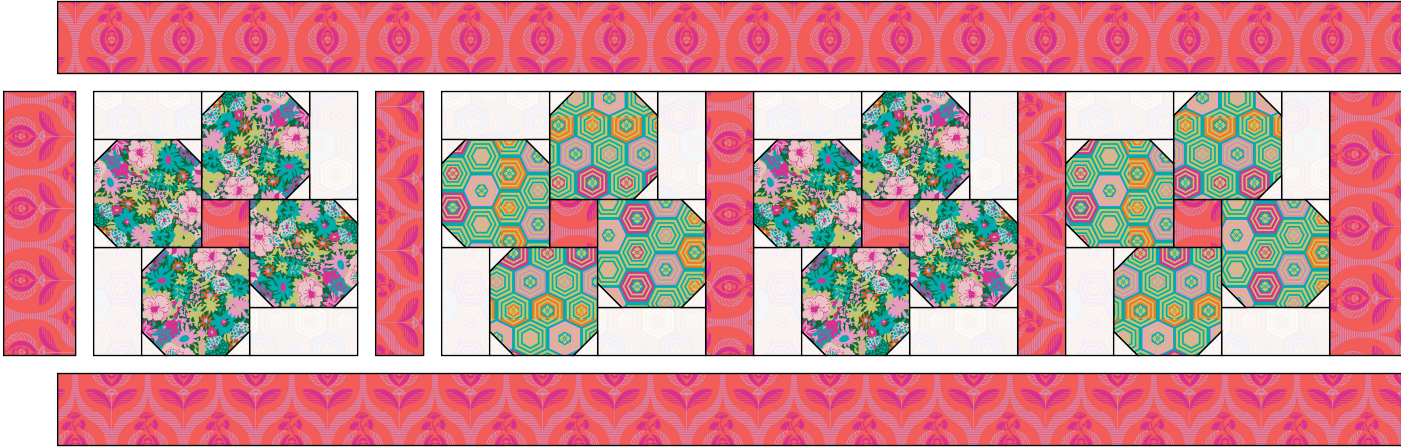
- 1.** Cut backing fabric into (2) equal lengths measuring 21" x 31-1/2" and sew together along short edges to make the quilt back.
- 2.** Layer top, batting and pieced backing. Baste if necessary and quilt as desired.
- 3.** Sew the four 2-1/2" x WOF B binding strips short ends together with diagonal seams. Press seams open. Fold in half lengthwise wrong sides together and sew to quilt with a French binding technique. Fold binding to back and hand sew down.

Be sure to put a label on the back and ENJOY!

QUILT ASSEMBLY

- 1.** Lay out four blocks alternating with three 2-1/2" x 11-1/2" D rectangles as shown. Sew the blocks and rectangles into a row to complete the runner center.
- 2.** Sew 3-1/2" x 11-1/2" D rectangle to the short ends of the runner center.
- 3.** Sew the remaining three 3-1/2" x WOF D strips short ends together into a long strip. Measure the runner length through the horizontal center and cut two strips to that length. Sew to the long edges of the runner.
