

1/3 Yard


B  Far Out Teal
VD3200-20
1/3 Yard


C  Far Out Green
VD3206-09
1/3 Yard

D  Far Out Orange
VD3206-10
1/3 Yard

E  Groove Green
VD3204-09
1-1/8 Yards

F  Groove Rust
VD3204-34
1-1/8 Yards

G  Spiral Rust
VD3201-34
5/8 Yards

H  Square Teal
VD3202-20
2-7/8 Yards

Backing: 3-1/3 Yards Batting: 60" x 78"

PLEASE READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE BEGINNING

- * All seams are sewn with 1/4" seam allowance.
- * Press seams toward each added piece.
- * RST = right sides together

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

**Cutting based on 42" wide fabric
(WOF-Width of Fabric)**

From Fabric A cut:

*** (6) 6-1/2" squares**

From Fabric B cut:

*** (6) 6-1/2" squares**

From Fabric C cut:

*** (24) 3-1/2" squares**

From Fabric D cut:

*** (24) 3-1/2" squares**

From Fabric E cut:

*** (24) 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles**

*** (48) 3-1/2" squares**

From Fabric F cut:

*** (24) 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles**

*** (48) 3-1/2" squares**

From Fabric G cut:

*** (7) 2-1/2" x WOF strips for binding**

From Fabric H cut:

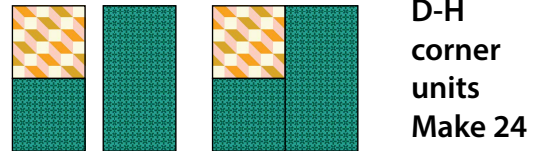
*** (96) 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles**

*** (144) 3-1/2" squares**

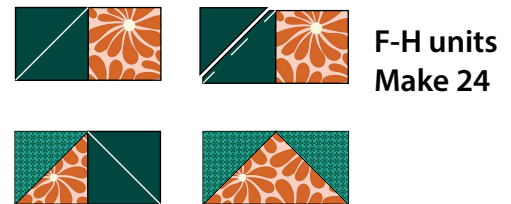
BLOCK CONSTRUCTION

Block #1

1. Sew one 3-1/2" D square and one 3-1/2" H square. Add one 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" H rectangle to the right side to make a corner unit. Make (24).



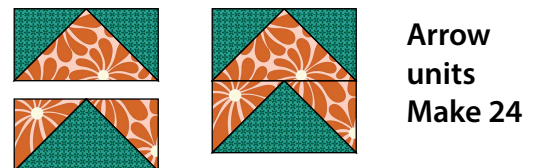
2. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of two 3-1/2" H squares. Place one marked square RST on one 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" F rectangle. Stitch on the drawn line, trim seam allowance to 1/4" and press open. Repeat with a second marked square on the opposite end to make one F-H unit. Make (24).



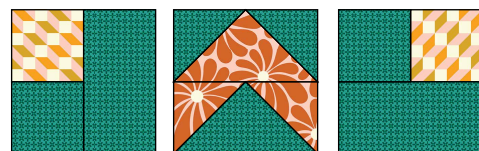
3. Repeat step 2 to make (24) H-F units.



4. Sew one F-H unit to one H-F unit to make an arrow unit. Make (24).

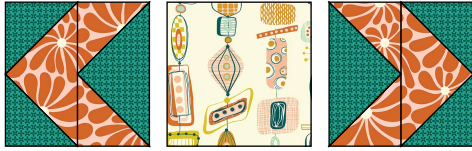


5. Sew corner units to opposite sides of one arrow unit, noting orientation. Make (12).

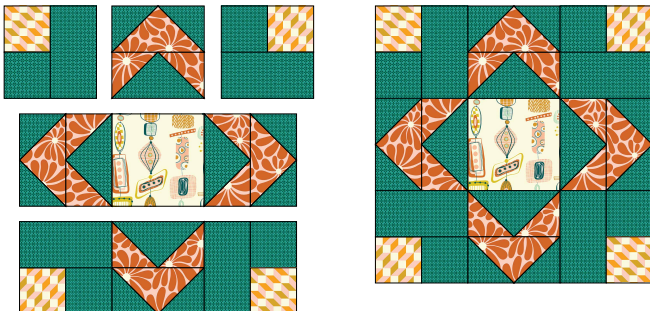


BLOCK CONSTRUCTION cont.

6. Sew arrow units to opposite sides of one 6-1/2" A square to make a center row. Make six.

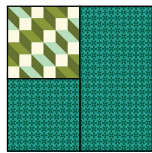


7. Sew the units from step 5 to opposite sides of the center row to make Block #1. Make a total of six of block #1.

8. Repeat step 1 to make a total of (24) C-H corner units.

9. Repeat steps 2 and 3 to make a total of (24) E-H units and (24) H-E units.

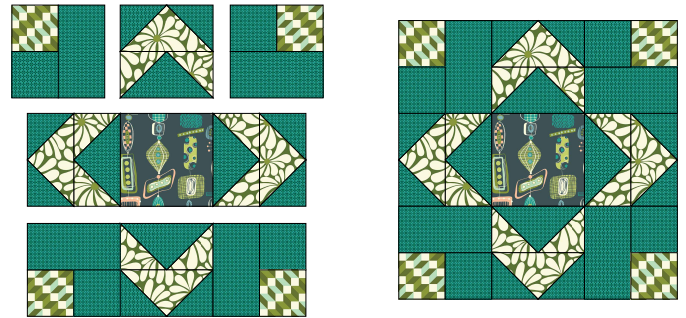

10. Sew one E-H unit to one H-E unit to make an arrow unit. Make (24).

11. Referring to steps 5-7, sew together one 6-1/2" B square, four corner units and four arrow units to make Block #2. Make a total of six of Block #2.



QUILT ASSEMBLY

1. Lay out the #1 and #2 blocks into four rows of three blocks each. Sew the blocks into rows and join the rows to complete the quilt top.

FINISHING

1. Cut backing fabric into (2) equal lengths and sew together to make the quilt back.

2. Layer top, batting and pieced backing. Baste if necessary and quilt as desired.

3. Sew the seven 2-1/2" x WOF G binding strips short ends together with diagonal seams. Press seams open. Fold in half length-wise wrong sides together and sew to quilt with a French binding technique. Fold binding to back and hand sew down.

Be sure to put a label on the back and ENJOY!
